



Educating High Schoolers About STEM Careers

(Top right) The **Smart Girls Rock** event coordinated by the Fox Cities Chamber of Commerce aims to give female high school students exposure to a variety of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) careers. The Menasha Corporation Foundation helped fund the event, with employees from Menasha Packaging hosting an educational station to teach students about careers in prepress, design and CAD (computer-aided design) within the corrugated industry.



Providing a Sense of Normalcy to Families Facing Pediatric Cancer Diagnoses

The Children's Cancer Family Foundation of Northeast Wisconsin (CCFF) helps families facing a pediatric cancer diagnosis preserve their family life when everything as they know it has been turned upside down by providing financial support. Through assistance from the Menasha Corporation Foundation, CCFF provided grants to more than 40 families in 2022.



Exhibit Educates Community on Monarch Habitats

The Paine Art Center and Gardens in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, conserves, presents and enhances the historic 1920s Tudor Revival country house mansion through exhibitions, art collections and the botanical gardens. The Menasha Corporation Foundation helped inspire youth and adults alike to develop and protect monarch habitats by helping fund the *Wonder of Monarchs* exhibit at the Paine Art Center and Gardens. Visitors learned about monarch lifecycles, threats and ways to make monarch-friendly habitats throughout the community.





Promoting Lifelong Healthy Vision

Prevent Blindness Wisconsin aims to improve the lives of children, adults and families through early detection of eye conditions to prevent blindness and preserve sight. They provide ongoing vision screening activities and state-wide public health education to promote lifelong healthy vision. The Menasha Corporation Foundation funding helped Prevent Blindness Wisconsin provide vision screenings for approximately 5,000 children and families in Winnebago County.



Sparking an Interest in Reading

The Fox Cities Book Festival offers a free, inclusive and public fall festival with presentations, selected readings, panel discussions, Q&A sessions, writing workshops and school visits. The goal of the Fox Cities Book Festival is to offer a platform for community conversations and learning by reaching readers of all ages and interests through this long-standing community event. The Menasha Corporation Foundation helped keep the festival and events throughout the year, like *The Making of a Picture Book* session held at the Elisha D. Smith Public Library, free to all.



Before and After School Programs Assist Families

The YMCA of the Fox Cities in Wisconsin provides before and after school programming for the Appleton Area School District at five sites. The program gives students a safe place to be where they realize their full potential and have an opportunity to participate in activities that promote health and well-being. The Menasha Corporation Foundation sponsorship provided supplies for art, science, math, tutoring support and enrichment activities for low-income students.

Changing the Lives of People One Home at a Time

The Greater Fox Cities Habitat for Humanity aims to elevate families to a better quality of living by providing safe, decent places to live. In 2022, the Menasha Corporation Foundation donation helped fund *Rock the Block* in Fox Crossings, Wisconsin. The event, which aims to beautify neighborhoods, included nine community projects and 26 home improvement projects.



Empowering Girls through Learning Programs

(Above left and right) The Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh, Wisconsin, provides youth development services and family support, such as after-school care, healthy meals and snacks, shower, and hygiene support and mental health services. The Menasha Corporation Foundation funding helped the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh run its SMART Girls program, a social and emotional learning program that helps participants learn positive communication skills and aims to build self-esteem.

Helping Those Facing Natural Disasters through the Red Cross

Through the Menasha Corporation Foundation, our company is helping the Red Cross prepare for, respond to and help people recover from disasters as a partner in the Red Cross Ready 365 Program. This year, those in Kentucky upended by the flooding and families in Florida and the Carolinas impacted by the destruction left by Hurricane Ian were aided by Red Cross disaster recovery response teams. As a Ready 365 Program partner, our employees can also contribute to a special Menasha Corporation Foundation giving page to help provide overnight shelters, meals, snacks and care to those dealing with the devastating aftermath of natural disasters.



Fighting Hunger and Sustaining Hope

Nearly 3,700 people are provided fresh produce, bakery, dairy, meat, non-perishables, paper products and other necessities each week through St. Joseph's Food Program in Appleton, Wisconsin. St. Joseph's Food Program is a nonprofit, non-denominational program that supports families in need, and receives no state or federal grants, making the Menasha Corporation Foundation donation even more impactful.



Employee Program Giving

The Foundation offers three areas of giving in support of employee volunteer efforts, donations to educational institutions and employees' children's higher education.

College Scholarships

\$ 81,860

For more than 50 years, the Foundation has awarded one-and four-year scholarships to eligible dependents of its employees. Winners are chosen by an independent third party based on the applicant's academic performance, financial needs, and other factors, including letters of recommendation and candidate essays.

Dollars for Doers


\$ 11,000

To encourage employees to be involved in schools, the Foundation's Dollars for Doers program donates \$250 to any elementary or secondary school that has an employee or spouse who volunteers more than 20 hours in a school year. And at the end of each school year, all schools that received a \$250 donation are entered into a drawing for a \$2,500 donation.

Matching Gifts

\$ 22,200

The Foundation supports the philanthropic efforts of its employees, retirees, directors of Menasha Corporation, and shareholders by increasing their giving power. The program matches gifts up to \$1,000 a year to qualified educational institutions.

Addiction Recovery Program Made Affordable


